



Hadassah Harnesses Medicine to Build a Better World

ike many South Africans, Hadassah was not on my radar before I started working as Director of the San Diego area 13 years ago.

It surprised me to discover that the hospital in Israel was founded by Americans. In 1912, before women had the right to vote, thirty New York Jewish-women banded together to raise money to set up a small public health station in Palestine. The purpose was to provide maternity care and treat trachoma, a dreaded eye disease rampant in the Middle East. In a few decades, these women built a mass movement, which today is the largest women's organization and largest volunteer organization in the United States with 330,000 members. I found much to admire about Hadassah, even as I was overwhelmed by its staggering scope and expanse.

In Israel, that simple nursing station grew to become Hadassah Medical Organization which has earned an international reputation as one of the leading medical centers in the world. A pioneer in stem cell treatment, it is also among the top three hospitals in the world for the treatment of Parkinson's disease. The organization, now in 26 countries, including China, Japan and Turkey, continues to raise millions of dollars to support the work of the two hospitals in Jerusalem.

One doesn't need a medical background to understand that when patients are cared for with compassion, healing is hastened.

I love that Hadassah continually seeks ways to address the emotional needs of its patients, especially children. Recently, Hadassah created outdoor therapeutic Healing Gardens. When possible, children sit in the gardens while receiving physiotherapy or breathing treatments. In the pediatric oncology unit music therapy is used as an intervention tool for children undergoing chemotherapy. My favorite is the medically trained clowns who distract and entertain children undergoing difficult medical procedures.

Hadassah is an island of peace in a region of turmoil and enmity. Its approach to treatment transcends politics, religion, and geographical boundaries, treating all patients with dignity. Hadassah was nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize "for meeting the standards of equality in the treatment of patients of all nationalities, and for Hadassah's contribution to promotion of the peaceful coexistence of nations".

It was in 2006, that I really learned about Hadassah. My parents had been living in Jerusalem for more than 20 years when on a Friday evening, my mother called. Something was terribly wrong, she never calls on Shabbat. My father was in the intensive care unit, gravely ill with colon cancer. Forty eight

hours later I arrived at the hospital, greeted by a nurse like I was a member of her family. Suddenly the daughter of a patient, Hadassah became a deeply personal experience.

I spent a week with my father, supporting my exhausted mother and pacing the corridors. I was filled with awe many times over. Every wall of the hospital is covered with the names of donors from around the world, some I recognized from San Diego. I was astonished when the surgeon gave us his cell number in case we needed him. Volunteers handed us meals and asked for nothing in return. A few times I had coffee with a woman whose Arab-Israeli mother was lying in a bed next to my father. She had flown in from Jordan the day after I arrived. From two different worlds, we were just two daughters waiting around for some good news. On Shabbat, I was deeply moved as I sat in the shul in the basement of the hospital, and saw patients being wheeled in to participate in the service. My father recovered. But a year later, the cancer reappeared. My daughter and I saw him one more time. He spent his last days in the Hospice at Hadassah.

It's a pity that the world does not know more about the reach of Hadassah's humanitarian work. Public health professionals from 90 countries have been trained in the International Masters of Public Health program at Hadassah. Many now serve as health ministers or directors-general of health in their native countries.

In 2007, Hadassah initiated "Operation Abraham," sending medical personal to Swaziland to perform male circumcisions, reducing the risk of HIV infection by 60%. Impressed by the results, the King of Kwazulu invited Hadassah to establish clinics in Natal. In Haiti, Hadassah doctors were some of the first in the world to set up operating tents following the massive earthquake. They delivered the first baby after the guake. His mother named him "Israel."

Locally in San Diego, women of all ages join Hadassah to meet and build social connections with like-minded Jewish women. Members participate in programs with guest speakers, join Hadassah book groups, and even play mahjongg. Women create friendships that last a life-time find intellectual fulfillment, and at the same time, contribute to the betterment of women in the United States and people around the world.



The JCC's Shalom Baby/PJ Library program is thrilled to announce the creation of an exciting, kid-oriented mitzvah program, "Mitzvah Kids: Making Kids Into Mensches."

This program was created in response to the limited or nonexistence of opportunities for younger children in our area to "give back" to their community. Most of the available projects are for older children. Mitzvah Kids will address this disparity by creating fun and engaging mitzvah-oriented activities for children between the ages 4 and 8. Anticipated activities will include bringing cards to residents at Seacrest and singing songs around the holidays; coordinating with the Hand Up Food Pantry to create age-appropriate opportunities for kids to serve that organization; working with a local animal shelter; conducting beach- and park-clean ups with the children; along with many other ideas. The goal is for the activities to be as hands-on as possible for the children, so that they can be engaged in this experience. Most activities will take place on Sundays at 1:00.

The program's inaugural event took place on Sunday, September 7th at the JCC. Participating children created "mitzvah bags" for those who are less fortunate in our community. The kids used large Ziploc bags and filled them with essentials that might be helpful to someone living on the streets: granola bars or other portable food, water,

toothbrushes and toothpaste, sanitizing wipes, clean socks, as well as a small insert card that lists various outreach resources in the area (homeless shelters, domestic abuse hotlines, etc.). In addition, music, refreshments, storytelling and crafts were provided as well as giving the children an opportunity to make their very own "mitzvah cape." Mitzvah Kids received an incredible response to this program, with over 100 children and parents participating.

The creators of Mitzvah Kids hope that, as families become involved in this project, it becomes not just a "special occasion" when they are doing something wonderful for the community, but rather a routine part of their lives - something that the children simply expect to do every few weeks. We all are so very lucky in what we have and in the comfort and security that we enjoy. It is our duty as parents to teach our children to appreciate how very fortunate they are.

Genetic testing is important when planning a family

Before you break the glass, learn about Jewish genetic disease screening.

WEDDINGS ARE HAPPY OCCASIONS WITH MANY TRADITIONS ASSOCIATED WITH THE CELEBRATION. OF COURSE, THE PARENTS OF THE BRIDE AND GROOM ARE THINKING, QUIETLY, ABOUT THEIR FUTURE GRAND CHILDREN, BUT WHO THINKS ABOUT SCREENING FOR JEWISH GENETIC DISEASES FIRST?

ABOUT ONE IN THREE ASHKENAZI JEWS IS A CARRIER FOR AT LEAST ONE OF MORE THAN 19 DISEASES THAT OCCUR AT A HIGH CARRIER RATE IN THIS POPULATION.

A CARRIER IS A HEALTHY PERSON WHO CARRIES ONE ALTERED OR MUTATED GENE OF THE PAIR FOR A PARTICULAR CONDITION. THE ONLY RISK FOR A CARRIER IS TO PASS ON THIS GENE TO THEIR OFFSPRING. THIS IS NO BIG DEAL UNLESS BOTH MEMBERS OF THE COUPLE ARE CARRIERS FOR A MUTATION IN THE SAME DISEASE-CAUSING GENE. IN THIS SITUATION THE COUPLE HAS A 25% CHANCE WITH EACH PREGNANCY TO HAVE A CHILD WITH THE DISORDER. SO YOU MIGHT SAY, WHY WOULD I WANT TO KNOW THIS SCARY INFORMATION AT THIS JOYOUS TIME?

In the case of screening for Jewish Genetic diseases like Tay-Sachs, Canavan disease, Familial Dysautonomia and many other serious conditions, testing before pregnancy is optimal. Once tested and with information in hand about one's carrier status, talking to a genetic counselor will provide the individual or couple with information about family planning options. All you need for testing is a simple blood test. If you are part of an

CLEARLY YOU HAVE TO KNOW WHAT YOU ARE TESTING FOR WHEN VALUE OF EARLY GENETIC SCREENING IS CLEAR. ONCE THE TESTING OF EMBRYOS IS DONE, ONLY THE HEALTHY EMBRYOS ARE IMPLANTED. THIS PROCEDURE IS ACCEPTABLE TO ALL GROUPS WITHIN JUDAISM AND THERE IS NO ISSUE WITH DISCARDING THE UNHEALTHY WHEN NOT IN THE BODY OF THE MOTHER AND FOR THE FIRST 40 DAYS OF PREGNANCY. SO WHEN I AM ASKED, I RESPOND THAT IT IS REALLY GOOD NEWS.

FIRSTLY ASHKENAZI JEWS KNOW WHAT TO GET SCREENED FOR AND MANY LABS HAVE THIS TESTING AVAILABLE. OFTEN IT IS COVERED BY INSURANCE.

WHEN YOU ARE IDENTIFIED AS A CARRIER, YOU KNOW YOUR RISK AND CAN ACT BY SEEKING GENETIC COUNSELING AND LEARNING WHAT THE BEST TESTING OPTIONS ARE FOR YOU AND YOUR FAMILY. THIS IS DEFINITELY NOT A CASE OF "IGNORANCE IS BLISS" BUT RATHER KNOWLEDGE IS POWER!

WITH A NEW BIOPIC COMMEMORATING HIS LONG STRUGGLE AGAINST APARTHEID, REMEMBERING THE CHILDREN OF EUROPEAN REFUGEES WHO HELPED

n 1963, after South African police arrested six Jews and seven blacks in a raid on an African National Congress hideout in the Johannesburg suburb of Rivonia—a sweep that eventually landed Nelson Mandela in prison for more than 25 years—a white newspaper asked whether nationalist Jews were unhappy in South Africa. The community's Board of Deputies responded unequivocally that the opposite was true, promising that South Africa's Jews were loyal and patriotic. "No part of the community can or should be asked to accept responsibility" for the actions of a few, the board insisted in its official reply.

In time, of course, Mandela became a hero,

A few had money. But all faced what has been described as a "double marginality": not fully accepted as white, while also alienated from an organized Jewish community beholden to the powers that be.

That so many Jews surrendered the comforts of their own relatively privileged lives—indeed, in at least one case, surrendered life itself—to join Mandela and the ANC, though they had little material stake relative to their black comrades, is in itself a testament to the radical legacy these Jews brought with them out of Europe to the other end of the globe. With a new film starring ldris Elba recounting Mandela's long struggle, we look at those Jews who stood with him, and marched with him, every step of way.

and the actions of those few became a point of pride for South African Jews. Beginning with his years at Johannesburg's more or less integrated University of the Witwatersrand—aka "Wits"—and later as an apprentice to a Jewish law firm, Nelson Mandela had a political life that was profoundly intertwined with those of Jewish activists who, to varying degrees, found in their Jewish identity the imperative to object to a system that, while almost completely welcoming to them, treated blacks in a way that many of these children of European refugees found discomfiting and familiar.

While most South Africa Jews took the silent, implicitly conservative position of the Board of Deputies, the great majority of white South Africans involved in "the struggle" were Jewish. Many were Communists. Most were lawyers.

azar Sidelsky, the South African-born son of refugees from Lithuania, grew up in the Transvaal highlands and paid his way through Wits by playing violin in a jazz band called Skoenie and his Connecticut Yankees. By the early 1940s, he was partner in one of Johannesburg's biggest law firms, where he ran a program helping black South Africans get mortgages they were otherwise denied. One day in 1942, an ANC member named Walter Sisulu brought in Nelson Mandela, then 24, whom Sidelsky hired as an articled clerk, enabling Mandela to qualify as an

attorney—a radical move for an established firm at the time. "It was a Jewish firm," Mandela later wrote in his memoir, Long Walk to Freedom, "and in my experience I have found Jews to be more broad-minded than most whites on issues of race and politics, perhaps because they themselves have historically been victims of prejudice." Mandela worked at Sidelsky's firm while earning a B.A. by mail order and later while studying law at Wits. In 1952, Sidelsky loaned Mandela seed money to start South Africa's first black law practice, and when Mandela married his second wife Winnie in 1957, he brought the wedding procession past Sidelsky's home as a sign of respect. At a kosher lunch in Mandela's home a few years before Sidelsky's death in 2002, at 90, the first black president of South Africa still referred to his former mentor as "Boss."

at Bregman, a cousin of Lazar Sidelsky, became a clerk at Sidelsky's firm the year before Mandela joined. The building had segregated elevators, but Bregman, a member of the Communist Party, rode with Mandela on the one reserved for blacks. In his memoir, Mandela describes Bregman—"Natie"—as his first white friend. Bregman schlepped his skeptical friend to Communist get-togethers in the early years of their friendship—gatherings populated almost entirely by blacks and Jews-but while Mandela was impressed by the "lively and gregarious group of people who did not seem to pay attention to color at all," he later wrote that he was put off by the Party's "antipathy to religion" and emphasis on class rather than race. As time went on, Bregman became religiously observant, moonlighting from his legal career

as a comedian at weddings and bar mitzvahs and particularly renowned for his imitations of Winston Churchill and Franklin Roosevelt. Bregman died of kidney failure in 2011.

rthur Goldreich was born in 1929 to a Afamily proud to belong to the Anglo-Jewish elite. At the school he attended in the northern Transvaal province, a Germanlanguage instructor once passed out Hitler Youth magazines, prompting young Arthur to write to Prime Minister Jan Smuts asking permission to be taught Hebrew instead—a wish Smuts granted. Goldreich began studying architecture, but in May 1948the same month the National Party won parliamentary elections, commencing the era of official apartheid in South Africahe sailed to Israel on a small boat, packed with Holocaust survivors, to join the Palmach. In 1954, he returned to South Africa and joined the underground Communist Party. A notorious dandy, Goldreich wore tweeds and riding boots and hung around the polo club, but it was all a cover: Goldreich's Gatsbylike persona allowed him to travel the world raising money for the ANC and provided the perfect cover for purchasing a farm outside Johannesburg from which the ANC's militia wing, the Umkhonto we Sizwe-translated as "Spear of the Nation"—could plan and execute a campaign of violence against the state. Mandela moved to the farm, called Liliesleaf, in 1961, disguising himself as a gardener. After the 1963 raid on the farm, the government called Goldreich "the largest fish netted"—partly because of his role in drafting battle plans, based on his experience with the Palmach, but also because of the prevailing assumption that it was Jews like him who were encouraging blacks to rebel. Goldreich avoided trial alongside Mandela by bribing a guard with 4,000 rand—the kid wanted a new Studebaker—and fleeing to Tanzania. Goldreich eventually settled in Herzliya, Israel,

and he founded the architecture department at the Bezalel Academy of Arts and Design in Jerusalem. He later became deeply critical of Israel's treatment of the Palestinians, describing the occupation of the West Bank and Gaza as "bantustanism" in an interview with the Guardian. Goldreich died in Tel Aviv in 2011.



arold Wolpe became politicized after participating in a Socialist-Zionist youth project of teaching at a local night school for blacks, where he witnessed firsthand the dehumanizing effects of a racist society. He befriended Mandela and other activists while studying law at Wits and became one of Mandela's primary lawyers beginning with the seminal 1955 political summit, the Congress of the People—filing a lawsuit to bar the police from the premises—to Mandela's final arrest about a year before the raid on the Liliesleaf farm, when Wolpe himself was detained before escaping with Goldreich. Wolpe settled in England and became a sociologist, writing a highly influential 1972 paper, "Capitalism and Cheap Labor-Power in South Africa," which melded the political and economic criticisms of the regime by demonstrating how apartheid effectively suppressed the development of an urban proletariat and therefore differed in kind, not only in degree, from ordinary racial segregation. Dan O'Meara, a South African activist and historian now based at the Université du Québec à Montréal, has written that Wolpe's work "quite literally reshaped the way in which vast numbers of people saw apartheid South Africa, and in doing so, made a huge contribution to doing away with it." Wolpe moved back to South Africa in 1991 and directed education policy at the University of the Western Cape until he died at the age of 70 in 1996.

Vossel Mashel Slovo, known as Joe, joined the Communist Party in 1942 and then lied about his age to join the South African army, with which he fought in Italy. After the war, Slovo became active in the radical Springbok Legion veterans' association and studied law at Wits, where he met Mandela. Just before graduating, he married Ruth First, the daughter of a Communist Party leader. "We took off half an hour from our respective offices to get married," he later wrote in an unfinished autobiography, according to the recen book Ruth First and Joe Slovo in the War Against Apartheid. Their home served as a center for radical organizing, discussion, and parties. When the police conducted one of their regular searches of the house in the 1950s, they confiscated a copy of Stendhal's The Red and the Black solely because of the title. Indeed, Joe was the primary link between the Communist Party and ANC in the late 1950s and was Mandela's partner in organizing the Umkhonto we Sizwe militia. Both Slovo and First were arrested and prosecuted in the Treason Trial of 1956, which was partially conducted in a converted Pretoria synagogue—the only record of either First or Slovo having ever entered one. Abroad at the time of the Liliesleaf raid in 1963, Slovo was eventually joined in London by First and their children. Though in his early years he was an ardent Stalinist-much more so than Firstby the late 1980s Slovo had become more critical of "socialism without democracy."

Returning to the country in 1990 after Mandela was released and the prohibition on the Communist Party was lifted, Slovo crafted the power-sharing agreement credited with making the transition to majority rule after the end of apartheid in 1994 relatively smooth. Mandela, Slovo's last visitor the night before he died in 1995, delivered an emotional eulogy at the memorial service. At the gathering, Khoisan X, a black activist a generation younger than Mandela, recalled hearing his son's friend once ask, after seeing a photo of him and Slovo together, "Why is your father shaking hands with a white man?" The son answered: "That's no white man. That's Joe Slovo."

Ruth First was born in 1925 to Latvian immigrants who

had helped found South Africa's Communist Party. The first in her family to attend college, First-described by her best friend as "sharp-tongued and shy"—founded the Progressive Students' League at Wits, where she also befriended Mandela, whom she later described as "good-looking, very proud, very dignified, very prickly, rather sensitive, perhaps even arrogant." Often compared to Rosa Luxembourg for her devotion to the strugale, First edited and wrote for various radical newspapers throughout the 1940s and 1950s, and was active in revolutionary politics. In 1963, First was arrested at the Wits library and endured a four-month detention, which she wrote about in a memoir,117 Days. First's Xhosa comrades called her yimazi ephah neenkati—a mare that keeps up with the stallions. While exiled in London, First became a United Nations observer to Africa and edited Mandela's writings and speeches into a book, No Easy Walk to Freedom. In 1977, she moved with Slovo to Maputo, Mozambique, where she lectured

and remained active in the anti-apartheid movement. First was in her office at the Eduardo Mondlane University in Maputo on August 17, 1982, when she opened a package addressed to her—sent, it turned out, by the South African security agents. It exploded in her face. She was 57.

ames Kantor was one of Johannesburg's most famous lawyers in the 1950s. He wore English suits, drove American cars, and lived in a big house with a pool and a Portuguese chef. Described by First as a "socialite yachtsman," Kantor dated models—until he married one, Barbara. But his sister was married to Harold Wolpe. Though Kantor claimed in his memoir not to know Wolpe was engaged in illegal activities—specifically, laundering money to help Goldreich purchase the Lilesleaf farmhe hired Wolpe at James Kantor & Partners, enough to make him accessory to the conspiracy, as far as the state was concerned. After the Rivonia raid, with Wolpe in jail, Kantor served as Mandela's lawyer until he, too, was arrested—just after Goldreich and Wolpe's escape. It was assumed by many in the movement that Kantor, who up until that point had not been a member of the resistance movement, was being held hostage until the escapees returned. In jail, he shared a cell with Mandela, who agreed to be godfather to Kantor's child. On the morning the judge in the trial, Quartus De Wet, was to issue a ruling on the motion for Kantor's release, Mandela found Kantor pacing up and down their shared cell. Mandela suggested they exchange ties for good luck. When De Wet dropped the charges against him, Kantor raised his borrowed tie toward Mandela "as a kind of salute and farewell," Mandela wrote in Long Walk to Freedom. After his release, Kantor renounced the legal profession and moved to London, where he died of a heart attack in 1974, just 47 years old.

elen Suzman, née Gavronsky, was for many years the only member of the South African Parliament opposed to apartheid. She was frequently the target of sexist and anti-Semitic attacks— "Go back to Israel!" she was told, though she was born in the South African mining town of Germiston—as well as subject to eavesdropping by the security forces, which she foiled by loudly blowing a whistle into the mouthpiece of her phone. Once, when a parliamentary colleague said her line of questioning was embarrassing the country, Suzman shot back, "It is not my questions that embarrass South Africa; it is your answers." Exercising her parliamentary privileges, she paid eight visits to Mandela in prison, bringing international attention and legitimacy to his cause. Suzman was distant from the Jewish establishment and critical of its silence on apartheid, according to the historian Gideon Shimoni, and when the Board of Deputies presented Suzman with its annual humanitarian award in 2007, she said flatly, "It's about time." Though twice nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize, she was heavily criticized for her opposition to sanctions and divestment—"I don't see how wrecking the economy of the country will insure a more stable and just society," she said—and pursued by accusations of prolonging apartheid by participating in a blatantly unjust political system, which made her enemies inside and outside South Africa. Suzman died on New Year's Day 2009.

PLAYING SOCCER AND BEING JEWISH IN A STRANGE LAND By Linda Bernstein

A San Diego soccer player living in Norway, unites with a Jewish Family from Oslo.

How did this union take place?

My son, Rhett Bernstein, is an accomplished center back who

has been playing professional soccer in Norway for the past four years. Following your dream requires stepping-out-of-the-box sometimes, even going to distant lands, far from friends and family.

Rhett was the CIF player of the year during his senior high school year. He played for the La Jolla Nomads and then went on to Brown University where he starred as a centre back. He was nominated twice as a candidate for the Hermann Trophy, the most prestigious award given to college soccer players. He was also College Player of the Week and on the Ivy First team. Rhett was invited to the MLS combine and an injury kept him from the trials. Rhett represented the USA in the 2008 Maccabi Games.

Now, because the population in Norway is very small, a young Jewish boy (and total soccer fan) named Yuval was watching soccer highlights on TV one night, two and half years ago he saw a player with the last name Bernstein. Yuval told



his dad Richard, that he thought there was a Jewish player in the Norwegian league and they must contact him. Richard found a way to contact Rhett and invited him to join their family for Rosh Hashanah and to go to the synagogue with them.

This was the start of a wonderful friendship for Rhett in Oslo. The Hercz family included him for all Jewish holidays and took a keen interest in his game. The family told me that Rhett has been a good and positive inspiration for Yuval.

We had the pleasure of meeting Richard Hercz and his son Yuval on my first trip to Oslo this past May. I was overwhelmed by the hospitality offered us and we got to see some incredible sights with father and son. They accompanied us to both Rhett's soccer games. It was so heart-warming seeing the interest they have in Rhett's soccer and Yuval is his biggest fan.

We were intrigued and fascinated with the history of Richard's father Imre who emigrated to Norway in 1952. Richard sent me the following information:

"My father was Imre Hercz (10 March 1929 – 24 July 2011) He was a Jewish Hungarian-Norwegian physician and public debater.

He was born in Transylvania and spent his childhood in Nagyvárad, in the Hungarianpart of Romania. At the age of 15, he was deported to Auschwitz concentration campin May 1944, later to Vernichtungslager Kaufbeuren and then to Dachau concentration camp. He survived.

After being hospitalized in Amberg for five and a half years, he recovered and emigrated to Norway in 1952 as one of several Jewish Holocaust-survivors accepted to Norway with substantial grants from the Norwegian government. He finished his secondary education in 1955 and graduated from the University of Oslo with a medical degree in 1961. He worked in Tønsberg, Vinstra and Brumunddal from 1962 to 1970, before opening a medical clinic in Høvik in 1971. He resided in Nesbru, and later moved to Høvik.



He was well known for his public stands on health policy, but even more so in the national debates on defamation and anti-Semitism. He held several public lectures for school students.

In February 2009 he won a ruling from Pressens Faglige Utvalg, where a comedian on national TV 2 was admonished for defamation and breach of the Ethical Code of Practice for the Norwegian Press. In June 2011 he was awarded the King's Medal of Merit. He was 82 years of age, when he died and was one of the oldest practicing doctors in Norway.

Today there are about 1500 Jews living in Norway. In June 2004 Chabad-Lubavitch established permanent residence in Oslo, serving Jews throughout the country.

HOW IS VISION AND LEARNING RELATED?

As an adult, have you never read a book cover to cover? Wondered why you don't always comprehend what you read? Or, have your eyes burn or become irritated and feel dry when using a computer?

Have you ever wondered why your child is smart in everything but school? Or why your child has 20/20 eyesight but may not be able to read or comprehend easily? I was 28 years old before I had my vision properly evaluated and although I became a doctor, I suffered tremendously through schooling, barely obtaining my dream.

This should not happen to you or your child. As a behavioral optometrist I am able to assess not only whether you have 20/20 eyesight but her you or your child may also have other inefficient visual skills that may be affecting the ability to learn efficiently but also the ability to read.

While ophthalmologists perform eye surgery, most optometrists evaluate eyesight and manage disease. I am one of only 850 behavioral optometrists in the country who in addition to the basic work that all optometrists, also evaluate the functions of the visual system that influence reading and learning.

The good news is that when we find these types of deficits, we can treat them and often eliminate them through the use of a program called Vision Therapy.

Vision Therapy re-teaches the visual system to perform at its peak level and eliminate many vision/learning related issues. We do not teach reading and writing, but we help the visual system get organized so that learning can take place. I specialize in evaluating the function of the visual system beyond 20/20 eyesight which will effect learning at any level.

The four most commonly misdiagnosed visual skills that are overlooked during a routine eye exam are:

- Tracking The ability to be able to move both eyes smoothly across a page when reading. This has nothing to do with eye muscle strength but the ability of the brain and eyes to work together at a conscious level of efficiency and increase the ability to learn. Symptoms of this type of problem are losing one's place when reading, skipping words and lines and rereading the same line.
- Convergence The ability of both eyes to be able to point to a single point in space, like, words on a page. Symptoms of this may include double vision, headaches when reading d a difficulty in maintaining concentration while in school for the whole day, or at work at a computer.

Convergence problems are often misdiagnosed as attention problems. One-third of all children diagnosed with ADHD have a convergence issue that is often overlooked. These types of issues have nothing to do with muscle strength. Convergence insufficiency can be successfully treated with vision therapy.

• Focusing near and far - This is the ability to shift one's focus from a desk to the blackboard and back again, maintaining



clarity and concentration throughout the task.

If this system is sluggish, symptoms include such as blur for both near and far vision, headaches that get worse during the day, fatigue when reading or copying school work. Muscle strength is not the culprit. In vision therapy we teach the brain where to look in space, enabling the patient to perform this task easily and efficiently.

• **Binocularity** - The ability to use your two eyes together. Convergence is an example of this visual skill but binocularity is necessary to use the visual system to obtain information from the world around them.

If this system is not working efficiently, depth perception becomes an issue which greatly affects the ability to play sports. Vision therapy helps an athlete to perform at peak level.

Children experiencing visual issues that are treatable will never truly reach their academic potential regardless of what school they attend. Each child should have a developmental assessment by a developmental/behavioral optometrist before first grade to assess whether they can benefit from vision therapy.

Many self esteem and peer pressure issues can often be avoided with the correct diagnosis. It is also never too late for adults to have a similar assessment.



It's really just anti-Semitism....again!

When I was growing up in Zimbabwe, being called a Jew-Boy was reason enough to meet on the Weinberg's lawn three blocks from Kumalo Junior School and go seven rounds with kids like Timmy McCallister and the bad boys from Tate House.

Back then, I always felt an undercurrent of anti-Semitism just beneath the surface ready to pounce. After all, the Bulawayo Country club didn't allow Jewish members, and the Bulawayo City Club was even stricter about who it let in through its Colonial doors. In fact, my dad's nickname at Caledon High was "Christ Killer". So it wasn't our imagination; it was a reality.

My generation was not that far removed from Hitler's Germany, and even though we did not experience the Holocaust, we certainly experienced anti-Semitism in one way or another most of our lives. For those of us who lived in Southern Africa, our entire socio-economic and political structure was based on labels, definitions and classifications. We were Jewish, or non –Jewish, white, black, colored or Indian. We were taught to see people within these classifications and most of us have spent our entire lives trying to unshackle ourselves from a system which never saw anyone as just another person.

Many of us moved to America in pursuit of a better future and I personally aspired to live in a society that did not judge people by the color of their skin but as Martin Luther King said, "By the content of their character."

America had its own racial history but was doing everything in its power to move on. Europe lived through the Holocaust and Nazi genocide, and it too appeared to push race and prejudice aside, embracing a political correctness that seemed too strong to ever allow anything like that to happen again. "Never Again" became the rallying cry from Germany to Israel and I think I actually believed it. Or at least I believed that everyone else believed it.

I was wrong.

I never understood how closely this rabid anti-Semitism lay beneath the surface of international respectability, and how easy it has been for this vitriolic anti-Jewish sentiment to surface and flourish around the world.

The world's reaction to Israel's defense of her own borders, (when threatened by Hamas, a terrorist group that has one of the worst records for human rights and civil liberties anywhere in the world) has absolutely nothing to do with Israel and Hamas. It is simply a "moral" justification for anti-Semitism to rear its ugly head and to allow a



forum for hatred and prejudice.

Where are the protests for the 200 children kidnapped by Boka Haram? Where are the boycotts against those who shot down 300 civilians in the Ukraine? Where are the United Nations' condemnations against ISIS? Where are the claims of war crimes in Syria, Iraq and Iran? It appears that so long as a Jew is not involved, these acts of terror and murder do not pierce the world's conscience or sense of justice and fair play.

I am a Zionist who believes strongly in the sanctity of Israel; however I am not an apologist for Israel, nor am I a person who looks beyond Israel's faults and mistakes. I do not hold Israel "blameless" in its dealings with the West, the Middle East or Gaza. But, when it comes to the survival of the Jewish State, I do not believe that it is possible to do what is necessary to survive, and also win the public relations war.

Amid the calls for boycotts, the undisguised bias of the United Nations and the anti-Israel marches in almost every major city, what is most interesting to me is how quickly the rage shifted from Israel to "Kill the Jews". The hysteria and vitriol is aimed at the Jews, not Israel, and it soon became clear that the facts and the truth were not important.

The three Israeli kids kidnapped and murdered were long forgotten. No one remembers the thousands of rockets fired indiscriminately at civilians, nor the tunnels that open Israel to daily terrorist attacks. Instead, what becomes

important is how quickly we can use terms like, genocide and ethnic cleansing, which have little meaning in this context, but are guaranteed to fire up the anti-Semitic rockets, which the naïve world swallows.

I guess that through all this I have realized that we Jews are really on our own...again. Sure Israel has the support of the United States, and most of the Western world will begrudgingly stand behind Israel, so long as she is fighting against terrorists

who may threaten their own way of life. India will hold the occasional pro Israel rally...and so will Denmark, (who always does the right thing with the Jews.)

But as the naiveté of Europe and the rest of the world continue to ignore the threat Islam poses to world peace, and as each country allows Islam to grab a greater hold on its society, this support for Israel will become an even greater question mark.

So, Israel must do what she has to do.

I hope she holds herself and her soldiers to a higher ethical standard, but she has to forget the editorials of the New York Times, ignore the pundits of CNN, laugh at the opinions of Jimmy Carter and forge forward with what is best for Israel — and what guarantees her survival. For in the end, it will be up to the Jews of this world to make sure that it is ...Never Again.




Bobba's Bulkas

Adapted by Orna Purkin from Bobba Skuy's Bulkas

Like many Jews in South Africa, it was our family tradition to break the fast on Yom Kippur with a warm bulka (yeast bun). Waiting in anticipation to bite into Auntie Phyllie's fresh-baked Cinnamon Bulkas made the fast all the more torturous.

When I moved to Los Angeles, my friend Dina's mom. Rita Blogg—who used to take in all the stragglers for the holidays—gave me a taste of home with these mouth-watering buns. They were passed down from her Bobba Skuy who grew up in a little shtetl in Latvia. Nothing brings me such joy as making them with my little Aja, and continuing our own special family tradition.

Orna Purkin (Shifren) is the founder of OrnaBakes where she shares (mostly) healthy recipes, and weight loss tips.



Ingredients

- 1. 1 cup butter, salted (plus more for brushing and greasing bowl)
- 2. ¾ cup granulated sugar + ½ teaspoon for proofing yeast
- 3.1 ½ cups whole milk
- 4. Cinnamon Sugar: ¾ cup sugar, 2 tablespoons cinnamon
- 5. 1 tablespoon butter, softened (for greasing the bowl)
- 6. Melted butter for brushing (about ½ cup)
- 7. 4 large eggs, room temperature, lightly beaten with a fork
- 8. 8 9 cups all-purpose flour, plus more for board
- 9. 2 x 1/4 oz envelopes active dry yeast
- 10. 1 teaspoon salt
- 11. 1/4 cup warm water



Instructions (Yields 32)

- 1. Set oven rack to the middle. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.
- Dissolve top 3 ingredients (butter, sugar, milk) in a small saucepan over low heat; set aside to cool to lukewarm.(Do not boil—just warm milk till butter melts.)
- 3. While it cools, stir 1/2 teaspoon sugar and yeast into 1/4 cup warm water—like very warm bath water. (100 degrees F on an instant read thermometer.) Let stand 10 minutes till foamy. If yeast doesn't get bubbly toss and start again!
- 4. Kneading the dough: Put 5 cups of flour in mixing bowl of your mixer, fitted with the paddle beater. Make a well in the flour and add yeast, beaten eggs and warm milk mixture. Mix on lowest speed just until combined and smooth, 1 2 minutes. Scrape bowl and paddle.
- 5. Change to dough hook. Add salt, and two more cups of flour, one at a time (with mixer off) and mix on low (Cuisinart #2) until each is incorporated. If dough is too sticky or doesn't form a loose ball that cleans the sides of the bowl, tap more flour on the side of the bowl ½ cup at a time, with mixer running, until fully incorporated. The dough should be slightly sticky and soft, or the bulkas will be heavy. Knead each addition until completely worked in to the dough.
- 6. When dough clings to hook, knead for about ten minutes until dough is smooth and elastic. (Cuisinart #3) Stop motor occasionally and poke dough to check for firmness and stickiness. Scrape bowl and turn dough over to incorporate all the flour. Knead just until it feels smooth and elastic and is no longer sticky.
- 7. Remove dough from bowl and form into a ball. Place in large bowl greased with butter. Turn over once to grease top. Cover with plastic wrap and rise until double in size in a warm place, free from draughts, about 1 $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours.
- 8. Once doubled in size, push your fist into the center of the dough; fold the outside edges into the center to fully deflate it. Flour board just enough that dough doesn't stick. Divide dough in half with a bench scraper. Return one half to bowl, cover, and refrigerate.
- 9. Working with half the dough: Divide in half again, and work with one piece at a time, keeping the other one covered. Gently shape into a rough rectangle. Slice in half, lengthwise. Divide each piece into 4 pieces; cutting off one piece at a time, 2 2 1/2 oz each, keeping the rest covered. Don't make them too big or once they rise and bake they'll be huge.
- 10. Roll each piece into a ball, and with the craggy side up, push down into your palm to form a round, about 4 inches wide and 1/4 inch thick. Place smooth bottom side on prepared baking sheets, covered loosely with plastic.
- 11. Melt 2 tablespoons butter in the microwave. Brush with melted butter and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar. (1/2 1 teaspoon each.) With a sharp knife, slit each round from the center to the edge. Fold one third of the circle on top of another third, and then fold the remaining third on top of that, to form a 3-layered triangle.
- 12. Combine all 16 on one baking sheet, about an inch apart because they'll spread and rise more in the oven. Cover loosely with plastic wrap and allow to rise again (not quite double), 20 30 minutes. Meanwhile, preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (180 C). When risen, brush the tops generously with melted butter (2 tablespoons) and sprinkle liberally with cinnamon sugar.
- 13. Bake 16 to 22 minutes until brown and not doughy in the middle. Rotate pans halfway. If the tops get too brown cover loosely with foil. If the bottoms get too brown place another baking sheet underneath. Transfer parchment to wire racks immediately to cool.
- 14. Serve warm. Reheat at 350 degree F for about 5 minutes, loosely covered with foil.



Comes to San Diego

BUILDING KNOWLEDGE, FRIENDSHIPS AND BRIDGES by Selwyn Isakow

It is difficult to describe the intellectual, spiritual and learning experience of being in a beautiful study hall surrounded by books, texts and reference materials. Add the sounds of partners and small groups of people discussing different subjects, enthusiastically debating points of view and inquiring about facts and theories, all within a Jewish context and it t is intellectually invigorating.

Partners San Diego is an independent local organization that utilizes the prayer hall at Congregation Adat Yeshurun in La Jolla for an hour every Monday night at 8pm. Men and women are invited to learn one-on-one with a chavruta (study partner) for a traditional yeshiva study experience. There are chavrutas and mentors for all levels of knowledge and observance. Anyone looking to probe a Jewish topic of their choice at any level, whether affiliated or non-affiliated with any Jewish organization, is welcome to attend. Coffee, sodas and cakes are available and there is absolutely no cost to participate.

Participants customize their learning experience at their own pace, stopping for questions, comments and discussion. Study partners may choose to learn: Torah; Prophets; Talmud; Jewish History; Jewish Philosophy; or any other subject in which they are interested. In addition, the program provides a catalog of over a hundred structured syllabi for those uncertain of a subject to study. Topics as varied as the Purpose of Man in this World, The Jewish Understanding of God, Reincarnation, The Jewish View of Ecology and the Environment and festival or holiday specific programs have been studied by different partners. Discussions on the weekly Torah portion and Pirkei Avos (Ethics of Our Fathers) are often overheard.

But sometimes partners just discuss what is happening in the news or at home and assessing the implications in a Jewish philosophical, theological or historical framework. "I look forward to Monday evenings when I can meet my chavaruta, Rabbi Ertel, and delve into resolving an issue of the day or week and comfortably enjoy knowledgeable answers for an uplifting hour or so... in a Torah atmosphere," said David Ellman, a regular participant in the Partners program.

Once a month, Rabbi Lenore Bohm holds a shiur on subjects of specific interest to women, with visual aids, questions and discussions. Rabbi Wohlgelernter can be found weekly in deep discussion and analysis of one or other subject with his chavrutas, a married couple. Other Rabbis, teachers and mentors from schools, colleges and various congregations are heard vigorously conversing about Torah or life insights with their study partners. And then, during the last five minutes of each study session, everyone is quiet and attentive as one of the participants share, with insight and clarity, a message about the weekly parshah (Torah portion).

"This learning experience has brought my husband and I even closer together," said Wendy Burk, CEO of Cadence Travel. "We actually have deep philosophical conversations with each other about the concepts discussed weekly with our chavruta." Her husband Harold Frysh continued, "The Partners program allows us to explore Jewish philosophy on subjects meaningful to us."

The program is based on the successful Partners in Torah program started by Yeshiva Beth Yehuda in Detroit in the mid-nineties. I was fortunate to be one of three pairs of study partners when we first started, and the program grew to 400 people studying at the Yeshiva weekly. This program truly cut across all levels of observance, knowledge, congregations and organizations and transformed the whole Detroit Jewish community by building one relationship at a time.

"I look forward to Monday evenings when I can meet my chavaruta, Rabbi Ertel, and delve into resolving an issue of the day or week and comfortably enjoy knowledgeable answers for an uplifting hour or so... in a Torah atmosphere,"

"Our San Diego program has three primary objectives," said Adam Kushnir, Program Director of Partners in Torah – San Diego. "They are to: build personal knowledge though study; build personal and intellectual relationships though study partners; and build bridges among Jews of all persuasions and organizations in the community though studying as a group. We strive to empower Jews of all backgrounds and affiliations to maximize their potential for a meaningful Jewish life and build an informed, united and timeless San Diego Jewish community." Kushnir continued, "This program is designed to supplement, not replace, learning with a favorite Rabbi at a synagogue or at another educational organization."





Real Estate Market toughens in San Diego... but it's still a good time to buy!

California home sales eased slightly in May as a shortage of homes and housing affordability concerns held back would-be-home buyers, according to the C.A.R.(California Association of Realtors)

"Since last summer, the market has been transitioning to a slower pace of sales, somewhat higher inventory and less upward pressure on prices" according to C.A.R. President, Kevin Brown. Generally speaking buyers felt less urgency to buy as affordability has become an issue and lending standards remain tight. However, a recent surge in mortgage applications, due partially to declining interest rates, may indicate that higher housing demand can be expected in coming months.

"Houses are expensive and wages are not going up"

•••••

Mark Goldman, a loan officer and realestate lecturer at SDSU, said the price run-up was completed in 2013 and the market was returning to normal. "Maybe it was just taking a breath. Houses are expensive and wages are not going up" he said. Goldman says he sees annual appreciation on the way down to roughly 3.5 percent. He said it it's still a good time to buy because values have already recovered as much as they will in the near term. It's different for investors, he said because buying doesn't pencil out for a big gain.

Following rapid home price appreciation, tightening inventory of distressed

properties and increased mortgage interest rates, the volume of investor purchases has slowed down by about a third from last year. Investors coupled with international buyers created a very competitive market for traditional buyers. Both investors and international buyers, often times, are able to purchase properties with cash, thus are not subject to the stricter mortgage lending environment. C.A.R.'s 2013 International Client Survey shows that international home buyers who worked with a REALTOR® purchased a property with all cash in almost 80 percent of transactions. They also generally had a much higher income, with the median at \$260,000, compared to a median annual income of approximately \$100,000 for traditional buyers. Most of the international buyers in California come from Asian countries, primarily. While investor demand is waning, demand from international buyers is still relatively strong in some parts of California.

Unfortunately and for the reasons just mentioned, the biggest missing component in the current market is the traditional buyer, and especially the first-time buyermany of whom are still living at home with their parents. California, in fact, has the highest share of young people still living with their parents. The share of young adults living with their parents in California is slightly under 40 percent. PROSECUTE UN FOR CRIMES AGAINST ISRAEL

For many years Israel has informed UN officials on Hamas getting UN permission to use UN facilities in Gaza for military purposes: schools and other buildings as weaponry arsenals and shelters for Hamas terrorists; UN school yards for launching rockets in Israel; UN vehicles for transportation of weapons and Hamas terrorists.

FRIENDS OF THE ISRAELI Defense forces (IDF)

The profound importance of the Israel Defense Force is demonstrated yet again in Operation Protective Edge initiated to counter the thousands of rockets launched against Israel's communities, towns, and cities, deliberately targeting its civilians.

As always, IDF soldiers displayed selfless devotion and courage, extraordinary capabilities, and willingness to sacrifice to prevent Hamas from achieving its goal of inflicting enormous loss of life and injury to Israeli civilians. Among other resources employed is the Iron Dome missile defense system, developed jointly with the United States and manned by IDF soldiers whose diligent expertise intercepted hundreds of rockets that would otherwise have landed in heavily populated areas, causing unimaginable losses.

The IDF initially limited its efforts to surgical strikes aimed at degrading Hamas' missile launch sites and storage facilities and command and control operations to avoid inflicting harm on civilians despite Hamas intentionally using its own people as human shields. Consistent with its "Purity of Arms" doctrine, the IDF has gone to unprecedented lengths to avoid civilian cavalities including sending evacuation orders by phone and leaflets and dropping harmless noisemaking devices to frighten civilians away from potential targets and even abandoning missions when a risk to civilians was identified. Unfortunately, Hamas coerces civilians not to leave proposed target areas thereby causing most civilian casualties.

The Israeli government's cease fire attempts were spurned by Hamas despite two unilateral cease fires honored by the State of Israel. Instead, Hamas intensified its attack by infiltrating terrorists into kibbutzim located on the Gaza border. One can only imagine the devastation these terrorists would have wrought had they not been intercepted and destroyed by the IDF. The Israeli government was left with no alternative but to authorize

the IDF to launch a ground offensive to destroy the tunnels, degrade Hamas' capabilities and impose a sustainable calm for the people of Israel. Tragically, the ground invasion has resulted in the loss of IDF officers and soldiers. Consistent with the IDF leadership doctrine of "Acharei" (Follow Me), a disproportionate number of officers, including senior officers, are among the many casualties. A review of the backgrounds of those fallen heroes and their families provides some measure of the immense loss to the nation and the Jewish People.

The IDF has called up approximately 56,000 reservists to ensure that the government is provided a full range of options to combat Hamas terrorism. More reservists are likely to be called up. Even if an acceptable cease fire is agreed upon, the IDF will have to remain in the field to ensure observance and to enforce its terms preserving the safety of the State of Israel. In addition to the tragic loss of life and devastating injuries soldiers have suffered and will continue to suffer, soldiers and their families lives will continue to be severely disrupted by long absences from their homes, children, spouses and work, not to mention the inevitable danger and stress. These soldiers deserve and need our support.

The Friends of the IDF has a unique single purpose which is to provide programs geared to directly benefit IDF soldiers in the most meaningful ways and designed to enable everyone to contribute and participate; irrespective of financial ability. The FIDF is also responsible for the Lone Soldier program having approximately 3,000 young soldiers from all over the world currently serving in the IDF. Tragically, two Lone Soldiers from the United States supported by FIDF, First Sergeant Nissim Sean Carmeli, 22 (z.l.) and Sergeant Max Steinberg, 24 (z.l.) both of whom served in an elite unit, recently



perished in combat. Because only a few family members would otherwise have been present, more than 20,000 Israeli's attended Nissim and Max's funerals in Israel thereby demonstrating Israeli's profound appreciation for Lone Soldiers.

Each and every FIDF supporter stands shoulder to shoulder with the brave soldiers carrying out dangerous and complex operations necessary to protect the State of Israel. This vital support sends an important message of U.S. support and solidarity and includes much needed care packages, R&R facilities, call centers and support for Lone Soldiers and financial assistance to families who will suffer financial hardship, and many more programs.



South Africa has been dubbed the rape and child abuse capital of the world. It's been estimated that one person (woman, girl or child) is raped every four minutes somewhere in the country. Every year there are media campaigns to highlight this scourge. There are also innumerable discussions and articles about family violence and sexual abuse in the media.

However, much of the focus is directed at South Africa's deprived communities, because we all "know" that rape, incest and other forms of abuse are a consequence of poverty, overcrowding, lack of education and poor social infrastructure. Things "like that" just don't happen in the relatively affluent communities – and certainly not in the Jewish community. Or do they?

In her hard hitting, fast moving – and at time humorous – novel, Marilyn Cohen de Villiers takes us to Israel, London and South Africa while peeling away the facade of the beautiful, wealthy, admired Silverman family.

"I got the idea for the theme of A Beautiful Family from my local police station commander who told my husband (a member of the Community Police Forum) that the high incidence of family violence in the orthodox Jewish community in Johannesburg's northern suburbs was a huge problem. I've lived in the area all my life; I'm Jewish; I regard myself as relatively well informed; and I was shocked. My first reaction was: Jews don't do that," Marilyn said.

"So I did some research into the subject and realized that this was an issue that needed to be talked about within the community – and probably in most Jewish communities around the world, if my research was anything to go by. However, I didn't want to write yet another dark saga about victims of abuse. I wanted to dig deeper; to tell the story of both the abused and the abuser; to try and understand the who, how and why of abuse."

A Beautiful Family opens with the mysterious death of socialite/philanthropist Brenda Silverman. The story spans 40 years with the truth about the beautiful family and Brenda's death recounted through the perspectives of seven characters: Brenda and Alan Silverman and their children Yair and Aviva; anti-apartheid activist Annette Davies; British millionaire Ben Shapiro; and Johannesburg newspaper reporter Tracy Jacobs.

TOMORROW TRUST BELIEVES IN A "HAND-UP" NOT A "HAND-OUT"

The Tomorrow Trust is a South African based non-profit organization that supports orphaned and vulnerable children and youth to achieve their educational goals as part of an exit strategy from charity.

The Trust does this by providing holistic care and aligning with likeminded partners (government, corporate, donors, schools, educators, care organizations) to collectively create sustainable opportunities for orphans and vulnerable children and youth to improve their current socio-economic circumstances.

The Tomorrow Trust was founded in 2005 by Ms Kim Normand-Feinberg, who is currently the CEO.

Ms. Normand-Feinberg, was born in South Africa and started in the arts. She played an important role in the South African Human Rights and Education space for the past 24 years. She ran and represented Survivors of the Shoah Visual History foundation in South Africa for 18 years and was the Founding Director of the Apartheid Museum. She became an Ashoka Fellow through her work starting the Tolerance foundation and now the Tomorrow Trust.

"We believe in a hand up that empowers and emancipates these children from poverty rather than a hand out that keeps them entrenched in charity," said MS. Feinberg recently.

"Our vision is to be the leading non-governmental organization that makes a meaningful and sustainable impact on the lives of orphaned and vulnerable children throughout their educational journey and allows them to reach their full potential," she added.

The Tomorrow Trust's mission is to enable these children to become self-sustaining and proactive members of society.

Originally, Ms. Normand-Feinberg, provided assistance to orphaned and vulnerable youth with post-secondary education, but she soon realized that their academic results were not indicative of their real potential. Furthermore, their results prohibited them access to a post-secondary education.

As a result extensive research was undertaken by the Tomorrow Trust.

"The results indicated that South African primary school children had poor literacy and numeracy as well as poor English language skills mathematics, science, biology, accounting and English skills, "said Normand-Feinberg.

"Educators had difficulty understanding the curriculum, and lacked the knowledge and technical skills to work in underGidve



resourced schools and large classrooms. With this information, it was necessary to address the core issues in order to achieve our objectives. This is how the Tomorrow Trust support programs were developed, "she said.

"We believe in a hand up that empowers and emancipates these children from poverty rather than a hand out that keeps them entrenched in charity,"

Tomorrow Trust which was started 9 yrs ago is tapping into the amazing potential of these children and has seen remarkable results. Their programs have taken children from 30% in Grade 10 to distinctions in Grade 12. Over 137 Alumni are now working at top companies with 3 Alumni completing their Masters degrees.

"Yes these young, inspirational, committed young people are indeed breaking the shackles of generational poverty and are showing how powerful they actually are," added Normand-Feinberg.

1. Start communicating early

Even for children at pre-school ages (1-5 years of age), you can find opportunities for "teaching moments" and encourage "positive experiences with money" with your child. Find ways to say a qualified "yes" to your precocious toddler rather than "no". Instead of a one-slot piggy bank, give them one with four slots to: "Spend", "Save", "Invest" and "Donate" the money. Then, help them put an appropriate amount of their pocket money into each slot. They will quickly learn to understand what each means.

2. Identify your parenting style

Every parent has their own parenting style that is usually based o personality and what was learned as a child. If you are highly organize and use spreadsheets, then use them. If you are spontaneous, then g with it. It is much easier to look for teaching opportunities in dail interactions with your child if you accept yourself- warts and all.

3. Make it fun!

Although the subject matter is serious, i.e. raising your child to be fiscally responsible adult - who says it can't be fun. You can play a game while driving in the car by asking your child if they can identify if the billboard advertisement on the roadside is one for a "need" or "want". The ensuing discussion will deepen their understanding of this important economic principle – in a fun way!

4. Have regular family meetings

Teaching respectfully communication by taking turns to talk and listen is a vital skill. There are many ways to do this. Find one that works for you and your family. We have tried many, and have identified three effective ways that can help you hold successful family meetings. One way can be to place a piece of paper on the fridge door and invite any family member to add an item to the list that later becomes the agenda for a meeting, once it is "full". End the session with a positive group affirmation, such as a group hug or treat, to make it a rewarding experience.

5. Don't be afraid.

sleep. Their mentor told me that they stayed

up to nearly 2 am, discussing the play, the actors, and the subject matter.

As I write this article, different parts of the world are in conflict...Israel, Ukraine, Iraq. Our humaneness seems to focus on differences rather than similarities. We must search for that portion of the human spirit that recognizes a need for harmonious coexistence, if not on a global level, then within our own lives.

A TRIBUTE TO NADINE GORDIMER

During the long years that I was unable to return to South Africa, where I was born, raised, and lived for the first 25 years of my life, I could spend time with Nadine Gordimer only when she visited Boston. She often stayed with close friends of hers in their home on a quiet, leafy street, close to the center of Harvard. She seemed to thrive during those visits, tasting the freedom that we who are privileged to live here too often take for granted.

It was a response I knew well: I had endured the offensive restrictions of apartheid, and breathed deeply on my few visits to the United States before I settled here. My husband, Anthony Lewis, and I often invited Nadine — for that is who she became to me — to dinner with friends, either hers or ours. As a young student in South Africa I had been an avid reader of her books and had admired her, always from afar. Here, in Cambridge, I discovered in a different way her demanding intellect, her incisive moral views, her generosity, and her sense of humor. A tiny, slightly frail-looking woman with a soft voice, she was made of steel. A white South African, she wrote again and again of the black experience under apartheid. That required courage. She never spoke of her political activities against apartheid at home — they were illegal in South Africa at the time. She chose to be known — she took the risk of being known only through her writing.

After the release of Nelson Mandela from prison in 1990, and the attendant political changes in South Africa, Tony and I would spend time with her each time we were there. We usually met at her home in Johannesburg where she loved to walk with Tony, himself an avid gardener, around the garden she loved, answering his endless questions about South African trees and flowering plants. As liberation from apartheid stretched into and beyond its first decade, neither Gordimer the writer

nor Nadine the person was blind to any offensive aspects of the implementation of democracy. She could be biting in her criticism, yet she never forgot the long, bitter, tenacious history of white domination that each new, democratic South African government has confronted. I loved her for that and for so much more.

In 2005 the brilliant, energetic Harvard professor Henry Louis Gates Jr., organized a stunning event. To celebrate the 70th birthday of the great Nigerian writer Wole Soyinka, the first African to win the Nobel Prize in literature, Gates invited three other Nobel Laureates in literature to an intellectual feast in honor of Soyinka: Nadine Gordimer (1991), Derek Walcott (1992), and Toni Morrison (1993). He asked me to introduce Gordimer, which I did to a packed, riveted audience at that historic gathering. A portion of my remarks follows:"I am an enormous, enormous admirer of Nadine Gordimer and her writing. One might be tempted to presume that my admiration stems from a shared history. We both grew up as children of privilege, white children, in the 'rigidly racist and inhibited colonial society (those are her words) of small-town, provincial South Africa. Our vision of the world took shape on the hard, cruel anvil of apartheid. We both found the voice of our conscience in words: mine in the law, hers in potent works of imagination. But it is much more than a commonality of formative experiences that draws me to Nadine Gordimer's work. Like readers the world over, I am touched, again and again, by the gifts she has shared with us: her humanity, her fierce integrity, her deep commitment to exposing the twisted roots of racism and all forms of inequality, her transcendent quest for justice through truth-


Others have captured these qualities better than I. Nadine Gordimer is 'archivist and

. . . lighthouse keeper,' said Swedish writer Per Wästberg [at the time of the announcement of Gordimer as the 1991 recipient of the Nobel Prize in literature].

Above her collected experience, the light sweeps, illuminating parts that would otherwise have lain in darkness, helping us navigate towards a South Africa that . . . depicts a universal landscape.' Paul Theroux calls Gordimer 'one of the most reliable witnesses to the seismic South African transformation' since apartheid's fall. And for Seamus Heaney, she is one of the 'guerrillas of the imagination.' Gordimer herself has said that, '[t]he best way a writer can serve a revolution is to write as well as he can.' Having written as well as she can for over 50 years, Nadine Gordimer is justly celebrated as a moving force in the revolution of the human spirit."Today I treasure my memories of that extraordinary evening. My memories of the times I spent with her? It is hard to describe what those mean to me.

They have 4 sons, Barry and Raphael in Pretoria, Javin in Baltimore and Lawrence in San Diego. They loved their 7 grandchildren and took an interest in their lives.

They were taken too soon, with so much life left to live. We all miss them very much.

Born in Johannesburg, South Africa, on July 23, 1943, Renee attended Waverly Girls High, and she worked at the nursery school King David Linksfield. She enjoyed spending time with her family, playing bowls in the park, and painting beautiful silk tapestries and shawls – the same way she colored people's lives.

Although he left us at age 91 on the day of his 59th wedding anniversary, his memory will never be forgotten. His love and pride for all of us will always be a source of strength. His honesty, fairness, equality, and moderation he stood for will be our path to follow and his sense of humor and love for others will forever make us smile.

Born in Lithuania, he immigrated to South Africa in 1926 at the tender age of two. He grew up in Mayfair with his father and mother Simon and Seina, his sister Tilly, and his brother Benny. In 1955, Morris met Bessie on a beach in Muizenburg one warm summer day, and proposed on their very first date. The rest is history. Morris and Bessie built a beautiful life together with their children in Green Side. He then opened his own successful pharmacy in Braamfontein. He went on to Pioneer the health food industry in South Africa. Way ahead of his time, he developed a range of the most delicious Mueslis and granolas that filled grocery stores all over South Africa.

He joined his family in America at the age of 75 and in no time at all he was working and playing the stock market. All while maintaining a great hand of bridge with his teammate for life, Bessie, and their full circle of amazing friends.

In 2011 Morris wrote his life memoir, published with the help of his daughter Simone; titled "From Baulnik to Mayfair and Beyond." Morris began the journey of compiling some of his most memorable life events and life lessons he could pass on to his family and friends. Throughout the book he highlighted the importance of mitzvot and maintaining the gift of Judaism. In the preface he quotes Pirkei Avot, "the world stands on three things; torah, service of Hashem, and good deeds" a direct reflection of his values. Morris never failed to forget a person, a teacher, a name, an address,

or a phone number. When he recounted stories of his youth, one couldn't stop to think that his mind was always as sharp and brilliant as an 18 year old. One thing Morris never forgot was the special Jewish blessing of the children, given to us in the Torah. Every Friday he would call far and wide to give all those he loved this special Shabbat blessing. He knew that even though he couldn't always physically be next to his loved ones, his blessing could always reach the extra mile.

In his book he devoted a chapter to his "wonderful wife, a beautiful, talented, mother, and grandmother, a true Ayshes Cha-Yil, and a woman of valor." He treated Bessie with great care and affection. Every morning he would wake up early to serve her coffee, along with a note of positivity beautifully drawn on a white doily.

A few weeks before he passed, he allowed me to give him an art class. He painted this watercolor 'tree of life' with very little assistance and was very proud of it.

I liken my dad to a TREE OF LIFE. As a tree gives shade and fruit, never asking in return, my dad protected, provided, and cared for all his family. He left a legacy of four children, eleven grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren; a total of 18 or chai in all. Within all of us, Morris planted many seeds that will continue to bear blessings and life for future generations.

At the end of his book my dad wrote his own Ten Commandments to show the values he wished to live on.

We are so grateful as a family for the role model we have been blessed with, and the legacy and values we were given.

Dad you will never be forgotten. Your words of wisdom, humor, and selfless acts of kindness will continue to ripple through our lives, the lives of our new generation, and those blessed to have you alongside.

"With our everlasting love." Your heart is always by our side.






